CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Davenport called the meeting to order at 8:17am in the board room of Laurens County Water and Sewer Commission.

Invocation was given by Commissioner McMurray.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Chairman Davenport asked if there were any additions or corrections to the November 27, 2018 minutes, as submitted to the Commissioners.

CHAIRMAN REMARKS

Chairman Davenport welcomed the press to the meeting.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REMARKS

Mr. Field welcomed everyone to the meeting. He stated that December was a busy month for Laurens County Water and Sewer Commission (LCWSC), and the new payroll system is up and running.

LCWSC MONTHLY FINANCIAL SUMMARY

The monthly financial summary was presented to the Commissioners. A copy of this summary can be found in the Commissioner Board packet.

November and December are included in the summary.

As of December 31, 2018, LCWSC had a total of \$4,764,822 in cash for operating and reserve funds as compared to \$5,298,597 this time in FY18. As of December 31, 2018, LCWSC is awaiting reimbursements totaling \$215,992 from various entities including SRF, EDA, and Mogul. This means the operating balance would be \$4,980,814 instead of \$4,764,822.

LCWSC MONTHLY OPERATIONS SUMMARY

The monthly operations summary was presented to the Commissioners. A copy of this summary can be found in the Commissioner Board packet.

Mr. Field reported 137 new services installed as of December 31, 2018, with 12 new services in the month of November and 16 new services in the month of December. There were 18 active service line leaks and 2 active main line leaks.

Mr. Mattison discussed water purchased and percent loss. For the month of December, the total water loss was 8% of which 0% was unaccounted for through background leaks in the system. The rolling 12-month average of loss unaccounted for is still below 18% at 13.48%. Mr. Field stated that we are making improvements in how we manage and track water loss.

Mr. Mattison also discussed closed leak work orders. There were 4 main line leaks closed and 11 lateral line leaks closed in the month of November.

Old Business

1. EDA Grant Update – Water System Improvements

Mr. Field provided an EDA grant update for water system improvements. LCWSC was awarded a \$3.1 million EDA grant in November. Project and cost summary are as follows:

Stagecoach Road Waterline Summary

- o 18,900 LF of 12-inch water line
- o The Stagecoach road waterline is part of the original WTP Project
- The waterline connects Maddens elevated tank to the Raider Road Pump Station and 500,000-gallon ground storage tank

2. Lake Greenwood Water Treatment Plant (WTP) Update

Mr. Field stated that USDA review process is taking longer than expected and then the government shutdown caused further delays. The schedule could shift a couple of months due to the government shutdown. USDA has informed LCWSC that the deadline of September 2021 is fluid and could be moved back if needed.

Mr. Price shared a power point presentation showing accomplishments to date and work remaining for the WTP project.
